



## Hampton Boulevard Water Pipeline Replacement Work set to begin in mid-summer

Dear Valued Customer,

The City of Norfolk Department of Utilities has hired T.A. Sheets Contractors to replace approximately 4,300 feet of 24-inch water main under southbound Hampton Boulevard between Terminal Boulevard and the Lafayette River bridge. The existing WWII-era pipe has been the source of major leaks due to its deteriorating condition. Replacing the pipe will result in improved service delivery to the area.

In order to minimize the traffic impacts of the project on such a heavily traveled and important thoroughfare, several meetings were held with area stakeholders, including local civic leagues, the Navy, the Virginia Port Authority and the Virginia Department of Transportation. As a result of their input, the sections of the project shown in blue on the map to the right will be constructed at night, between the hours of 5 p.m. to 6 a.m. The segment shown in yellow will be constructed in the daytime between 7 a.m. and 3 p.m. During work hours, traffic will be reduced to one lane around the immediate construction area. Neighborhood access will be maintained throughout the project.
